












#### Praying through the Seasons on the Labyrinth

#### A Series of Three Retreats

Minnesota is known for its beautiful autumns, cold winters, and hopeful springs. During this series of three retreats, we will use the labyrinth to explore the spiritual invitations of each season. As we pray our way through outer and inner landscapes, the cycle of nature will lead us on our path toward sacred connections.

These 2 1/2 hour retreats are designed to support your spiritual growth. The labyrinth is a gentle tool that is well suited for exploration and transformation. Ritual movement, quiet reflection, and communal prayer will be part of each retreat.

#### Autumn Retreat

Wednesday, November 10 9:30 a.m.-noon As the earth quiets itself, our attention will be focused within. Using the labyrinth, we will search for our own sense of inner peace and gratitude. Before the holidays begin, come experience the gifts of rest and silence.

Where does your spirit find shelter when the external environment is cold, dark, and barren? As we move on the labyrinth, we will seek to receive the sacred gifts offered in winter.

Leader: The Rev. Jill Kimberly Hartwell Geoffrion, Ph.D., is the author of six books on labyrinth prayer. She makes frequent research trips to Chartres Cathedral in France and its labyrinth. In these retreats, Jill's love of creating labyrinth experiences that support spiritual unfolding will be yoked with her passion for transformational prayer.

Retreats can be taken individually or experienced as a series. No prior labyrinth experience is necessary. Participants are encouraged to bring their

favorite art supplies and a journal.



The labyrinth can be understood as many things: a pathway of prayer and meditation, a beautiful spiritual symbol, an archetypal pattern of healing, and even a sacred message of Divine Love. The labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral was constructed in 1201 CE using the art of sacred geometry. What might we discover if we prayed the labyrinth with an awareness of some of the symbolic meanings that are encoded in its shapes? Come find out!

First time labyrinth explorers are welcome. These retreats will be especially meaningful for those who have been using the labyrinth regularly. No mathematical background is needed, just bring an open mind and heart, personal art supplies and a journal.
