In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage."

When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was.

When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Three stages of pilgrimage and labyrinth walking that also appear in the Epiphany Story:



Journey away from home/towards the "goal" (the way in) Encounter at the site (center) Returning home (the way out)

A call: An invitation to know the Holy One more fully

Formulating a response based on what has been revealed

Leaving the familiar: traversing the unknown while carrying a chosen gift



What call has The Divine revealed to me?

How do I want to respond? (What is needed? What gift will I take with me?)

Am I willing to leave where I am to seek The Holy One so that I may present my gift?





Who has never walked a labyrinth?

Who has walked a labyrinth 1-10 times?

Labyrinths are designs that consist of a single, winding path that begins at the periphery and leads to a central space. The way out is on the same path, but in the opposite direction.





A labyrinth has one--and only one--pathway. Mazes have many. There are no tricks or dead ends in a labyrinth.

You can't get lost.

You enter the labyrinth through its "gate" or "door." Then, you follow its pathway to the center.





When starting to walk in a group, wait until the person in front of you goes around the first turn. This gives her/him time and space to find an initial rhythm that feels comfortable. Then, it's your turn to cross the threshold.

Pay special attention as you turn.



Walk at your own pace. It may change. Follow your internal rhythm.

When walking a labyrinth you can move around another person, or let someone "pass" you.

You can get turned around, but it's not a problem. You will end up either in the center or at the doorway. Continue from there.

Pay attention. What you experience has EVERYTHING to do with what you are considering and seeking.

What call has The Divine revealed to me?

How do I want to respond? (What is needed? What gift will I take with me?)

Am I willing to leave where I am to seek The Holy One so that I may present my gift?

When you have answered these three questions, enter the labyrinth and walk towards what you have been called to find. If possible, do not enter the center (yet). We three kings of Orient are Bearing gifts we traverse afar. Field and fountain, moor and mountain, Following yonder star.

O star of wonder, star of night, Star with royal beauty bright, Westward leading, still proceeding, Guide us to thy perfect Light.
