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
Before entering: Prepare yourself for your walk.




Ask God to speak to you as you walk.



Move through the open door into the labyrinth.




Moving Towards the Center: (you WILL get there, but it is a journey)!

Listen.


Receive.

There is room in the center for many people.






You return to the door of the labyrinth by following the pathway in the opposite direction.






A Double meander

First stone of the Chartres, France labyrinth shaped like a chalice. Installed in 1201.







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
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









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Creation of contemporary Christian labyrinth patterns
